



A HISTORY OF THE ROCHESTER CHAPTER, SAR 2ND CENTURY, 1ST DECENNIUM

The first decade of the second century of the Rochester Chapter, SAR, found a very active schedule led by only two presidents, Stephen A. Arter (1991-2001) and Stephan P. Clarke (2001-2005), and a Board of Managers committed to the success of the Chapter's endeavors.

Following the events of the centennial year—including the 100th anniversary banquet which saw the only instance in the Chapter's history when a live band was hired to provide music for dancing—the Chapter settled down to the usual routine of monthly meetings and various holiday and awards luncheons. The year began with the annual meeting in January, a celebration for George Washington's birthday in February, the Joint Meeting with our compatriots in Buffalo, and smaller luncheons for Fire Safety and Law Enforcement awards, usually held in September and November if the award was selected for presentation. The Board of Managers continued to meet on the second Wednesday for several years, but then changed to the third Wednesday of the month, a schedule they still maintain. The George Washington's birthday gathering and the Joint Meeting with Buffalo are the usual showcases for special guests and speakers, and the presentation of such awards as bronze, silver or gold Good Citizenship Medals, the War Service Medal, and other such significant honors.

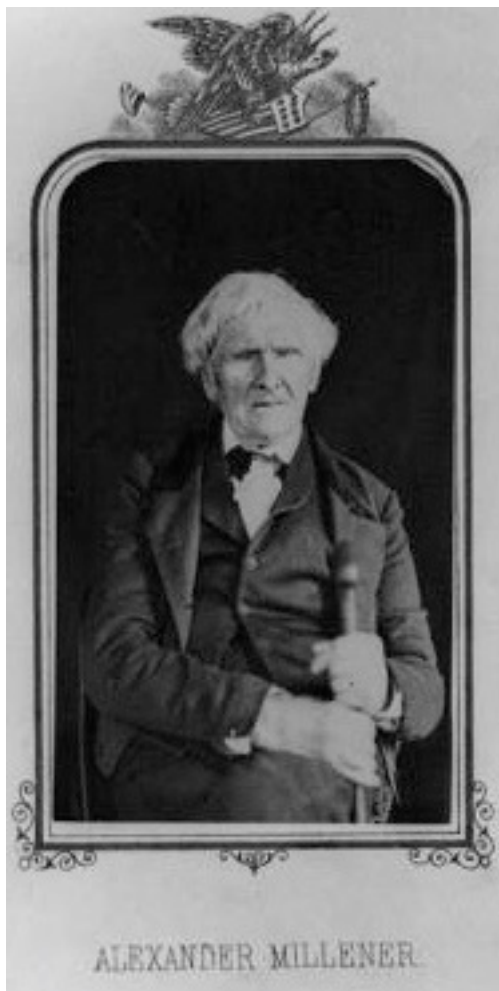
The Chapter's activities also included an ongoing program of good citizenship recognition

in the public schools of both the Rochester City School District and the public and parochial schools of Monroe County.

The Livingston Award consists of a Saving Bond and a certificate presented in honor of Robert Franklin Livingston who died as a war hero in Germany near the end of World War II presented to a graduating senior in each of the School District's high schools. The award is funded by the Livingston bequest from the estate of Robert Livingston, the sergeant's mother.

The Alexander Millener Award consists of a certificate and lapel pin presented to a graduating senior each of the public, private or parochial high schools in Monroe County. Millener was George Washington's drummer who retired to Monroe County and lived in the Adams Basin area, west of Spencerport, for many years. He is one of only a handful of Revolutionary War Patriots who lived long enough to have a photograph taken.

Once in a while some singular events occur that require special notice. Foremost among these was the election of President Steve Arter as Empire State Society president. Steve served two terms from 1996-98. Other special events took place in the period from 1999 to 2000.

The Rochester Chapter, in conjunction with Rochester Area Ivy Alliance Alumni Clubs attempted to start an ongoing award of national ranking and created the Frank E. Gannett Spirit of the American Minuteman Award that was presented to R. James Woolsey, public

servant and former Director of the Central Intelligence Agency (1993-95) on Friday, 26 February 1999. The award was a bronze statue of a Minuteman created especially for this ceremony. However, an honest appraisal of the expenses involved with operating so large and costly an affair led to the Chapter's sad admission that it was beyond our capabilities to fund and support on an annual basis.

Further sadness developed when Rochester and Empire State President Arter was undermined in his election bid for Vice-President General, Northeast District. A member of another Empire State chapter undercut President Arter's nomination when Steve was the nominating committee's only choice for the office. This action led Steve to respond to the situation with some sharply worded letters. Further letters of censure and rebuke followed one upon another until the Rochester Chapter withdrew its support for a National Congress to be held locally. Still more exchanges followed regarding other incidents as well, but the Chapter has grown beyond those issues and continues to grow.

On a much happier note, the Rochester Chapter became involved with a series of grave marker dedication ceremonies for Patriots and for SAR members who died while a member of the SAR in good standing. In October 2000, a group of Rochester members traveled to Naples for the dedication of a marker for Lt. Moses Barker who served with the Green Mountain Boys. Other such ceremonies have been performed in Hopewell for Patriot William Wyckoff, at Rush for Patriot Isaac Campbell, and for Patriot James Parmely at South Bristol, and at Geneseo for Patriots Daniel Kelly and John Bosley. Also, members of the Rochester Chapter attended the DAR dedication ceremony for a grave marker for Patriot Gideon Durfee in Palmyra, and a ceremony to dedicate a deceased member's marker was conducted at the grave of Chapter Past-President Roger Ruth in Parish, NY.

An ongoing program, begun at the direction of Past-President Steve Arter and completed by President Steve Clarke, involved the search for lost parts of the Eddy Collection, a substantial gathering of Revolutionary and Civil War documents and artifacts collected in the late 1800s by G. Schulyer Eddy, a descendant of Gen. Philip Schuyler. In 1912, the Rochester Chapter purchased the items, consisting of many documents and letters and a number of artifacts purported to be from the Saratoga Battlefield. The Chapter fell on hard times after World War I and the items were dispersed among members of the Chapter. Beginning in the early 1990s, President Arter began a whole-hearted attempt to gather the materials together into a single collection in order to preserve them and make them available for scholars to

study, but achieved only partial success as too many of the members had either died or moved out of town, etc. The last of the documents known to exist was turned over to President Clarke in 2003. With financial support from Compatriots W. Alex Williams and Stephan Clarke, the Chapter embarked on a restoration and preservation campaign with the help of Fred Jordan and Alexander Wieber, professional restorers of documents and wax seals, respectively. In July 2004, the collected documents and seal were turned over to the Department of Rare Books and Special Collections at the University of Rochester. The Library will have custodial care of the material for a period of 10 years after which, if not reclaimed by the Rochester Chapter, the Library will retain full and complete ownership of the collection. The non-document items remain in the keeping of the Chapter. Unfortunately, any provenance for those items has long-since been lost.

The Rochester Chapter also participates in the Knight Essay Contest by advertising it in local high schools and encouraging seniors or college freshmen and sophomores to submit entries. The award consists of a certificate and financial recognition—the amount of which may vary from year-to-year—and is awarded by National. State Societies send their winners on to National where the final selection is made. The essay is to be no longer than 500 words. In 2004, Daniel Sigler, a high school senior from Pittsford, a Rochester suburb, won the Knight Essay Contest at National for his essay about the Constitution and the separation of church and state entitled, “Framed with Religion in Mind.” The Rochester Chapter is proud to have sponsored Dan and is most pleased that his excellent essay achieved the recognition it is due.

The final major function for Rochester Chapter in this decennial period was to participate actively in the 225th Anniversary Ceremonies for the commemoration of the Groveland Ambuscade on the weekend of 11-12 September 2004. Chapter members manned a recruitment and information table at the Ambuscade site and President Steve Clarke was the

featured speaker at the Ambuscade Monument ceremonies. The Groveland Ambuscade was the final military action of the Sullivan-Clinton Campaign of 1779 and the last military encounter of the Revolutionary War in western New York.

As we enter the second decade of our second century as an active SAR chapter, it is our goal and hope to continue to support the standards of patriotism, education and community service that have always been the hallmarks of the SAR.
